All things come from God, and of his own do we give Him



Those words were said by King David when he had gathered the materials ready for his son, Solomon, to build the Temple in Jerusalem. They are interesting words to ponder as we celebrate Harvest in 2024.

Earlier in the year, Joe Stanley, Farm Manager of the Game and Wildlife Conservation Trust farm in Leicestershire, became infamous for saying that 2024 was the year with no harvest. He later modified that in his regular column in the NFU Countryside magazine by saying the year could be summed up by saying "The wrong weather in the wrong amount at the wrong time." One of the Agricultural Chaplains told a similar story in Cheshire. The 2023-24 farming year has been challenging. Yet despite it all, harvest has been variable and there is a harvest. Spring barley is good enough to malt, so there will be beer and whiskey. The blackcurrant crop amounts to a whopping 11,600 tonnes, of which Ribena will use 90%, so no shortage of Ribena. Whether the equivalent of 11 million loaves produced in the UK each day will be made from 85% British flour as usual, time will tell.

God has given us a harvest, and we offer it back to him as we sing our harvest praises. But to see harvest as just farmed produce, or the produce of our gardens, is to reduce our offering back to God. For many of us our harvest is our time, our gifts and skills, our money. God has given us all things. The least we can do is to offer praise to Him for everything He has given us. Sometimes we can give our time, our skills, our gifts and our money back to Him in service as well, which really is food for thought.

The Apostles; Bartholomew

Bartholomew means the 'son of the furrows' in the Aramaic language, so it is likely that he was from a farming family in the area of Galilee. In the Gospel of John, he is usually referred to as Nathanael, not Bartholomew, and he has the same name in the Qur'anic writings of the Muslim faith. He is another of the apostles about whom we know little from the gospels, but is surrounded by legends concerning his life after the Ascension of Jesus into Heaven. The apostles went out across the ancient World to tell of the life of Jesus and their faith in Him as the Son of God. Bartholomew is said to have travelled as a missionary in the area of India now known as the Bombay coastal region, where he left a copy of the Gospel of Matthew. Then onto Ethiopia, Parthia, Mesopotamia and greater Armenia. In Armenia Bartholomew was with Jude Thaddeus, and together they are credited with bringing Christianity to Armenia in the first century AD. Both are now recognised as Patron Saints of Armenia.

However, it was said to be Armenia where Bartholomew was martyred, although other legends say that his death occurred in Dogestan, Azerbaijan or Eastern Turkey. In Armenia he is reputed to have converted King Polymius to Christianity, against the will of the King's brother, Prince Astyages, who feared a Roman backlash. In a fury he ordered the torture and execution of Bartholomew. This was carried out by the apostle being flayed alive, his skin removed with knives or blades. This horrific torture is shown in art by Bartholomew holding his skin in his arms like a towel, or having it draped around his neck. Often the image includes golden knives or scissors to show how he was tortured.

Following this ordeal his body did not lie in rest for long. Relics of his body were given by Anastasius, the Byzantine emperor, to the city of Daras in Mesopotania 507 AD. A piece of skin and several bones were said to have been washed up at Lipari, an island off Sicily, and were transferred to Benevento in 838 AD where they still lie in the basilica. In 983 AD the Holy Roman Emperor, Otto II, gave relics to Rome. San Bartolomeo all'Isala was then founded on the site of the Asclepius, an important pagan Roman medical centre. This location led to St. Bartholomew being closely associated with hospitals throughout the Christian world. In London the St Bart's Hospital



was first established in 1123 AD. On a happier note St Bart's feast day on August 24th was an opportunity for celebration in Britain and throughout Europe. There was a Bartholomew Fair in the Smithfield area of London throughout the

Middle Ages. At Crewkerne in Somerset there was a St. Bartholomew Street Fair every August from Saxon times. The festival is noted in the Domesday Book and the British Library has a charter from 1280 AD granted to Crewkerne for its street fair, although it was said to have been granted by Henry III at an even earlier date. The beautiful church at Church Minshull is dedicated to St. Bartholomew, so we can celebrate his August feast day close to home and remember his missionary work far and near.

Recipe

Cheese Scones

Ingredients

- 225g/8oz Self Raising Flour
- ā 55g/2oz Butter
- 55g/2oz Mature Cheddar Cheese
- Good pinch English Mustard Powder
- Small Egg
- ā Milk



Try this recipe for Cheese Scones, it won first prize at this year's Nantwich Show for Jill Hodgson, brought up in Welshmans Lane, an Acton girl, educated, confirmed and married in the parish, now retired and living on the other side of town.

Well Done Jill

Method

- Heat oven to 220c Gas 7
- Lightly grease a baking tray
- Rub butter into the flour with the mustard.
- Mix in grated cheese.
- Beat egg with a little milk and stir into flour with a metal knife to make a soft dough.

best in

- Turn onto floured board and knead lightly. Pat down to a round 2cm/3/4in thick. Do not use a rolling pin!
- Use a 5cm/2in plain cutter and press out scones.
- Lightly knead together remaining dough and press out more scones to use up the dough.
- Brush the top of the scones with a little milk and sprinkle with a little finely grated cheese.
- Bake for 12-15 minutes until well risen and golden brown.
- Cool on a wire rack.

Acton CE Primary Academy

As we start another new school year, we have been thinking about new beginnings. The children have eagerly returned to school, into their new classrooms, many of which have benefitted from a refurbishment over the summer.

Christian schools have a distinctive ethos and that "special feel" and as part of our commitment to our distinctive Christian ethos, each class this year will be focusing on a different Christian value. Throughout the year the children will be having the opportunity to put their Christian values into action through their words and deeds. They will reflect on their behaviour to help them flourish and succeed as individuals and achieve our vision that "through God nothing is impossible".

Reception children will be focusing on the value of Friendship as they make new friends in their own class and form new bonds with their year 6 buddies who will care for and nurture them throughout the year. The class will become familiar with Bible stories about friendship as well as remembering that Jesus was a friend to all. The Bible tells us to: "Encourage one another and build each other up" 1 Thessalonians.

Year 1: Thankfulness

'Praise the Lord. Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good: His love endures forever.' Psalm 106:1 Our year 1 children will be encouraged to be grateful and give thanks for our school, our teachers, their friends and family. They will be reminded of the story of the ten lepers where although nine were healed only one made the journey and took the time to say, "Thank you" to Jesus.

Year 2: Forgiveness

'Just as the Lord has forgiven you so you must forgive others' - Colossians 3:13 Our Year 2 children will be looking at the many parables showing that Jesus talked about forgiveness and being encouraged to forgive one another.

Year 3: Truthfulness

Our older children in Key Stage 2 will be given the challenge of remembering to act with truthfulness. As a school, we encourage the children to show courage and accept responsibility even if they don't always make the right choices, accepting that each day is a clean slate. Our Bible reference for this is: 'Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free' - John 8:32

Year 4: Service

As our older children become ambassadors for the school, they have increasing opportunities to put their Christian values into practice. Throughout the year there are opportunities for every class to show acts of service. We remember the Bible teaches us to: 'Serve one another in love' - Galatians 5:13

Year 5: Respect

As a school we have 3 very simple rules that underpin all that we do.

To be ready,

To be respectful and

To be safe

By following these 3 simple rules we ensure that our school is a safe, happy and calm environment where all feel safe. We remember the Bible reminds us to: 'Do to others as you would have them do to you.' – Matthew 7:12

Year 6: Compassion

And finally, our eldest children are taught to understand the importance of compassion as they begin to make sense of the world in which they live, learning that sometimes life may not seem fair and there are injustices created by mankind. We encourage our next generation to learn from the errors of previous generations and to follow Christ's example in order to create a better future for themselves. This is echoed in the Bible verse from Ephesians 4:32: "Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."


